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Jeff and I recently celebrated our ten-year anniversary. I still remember our wedding day like it was yesterday, jumping up and down when the pastor pronounced us husband and wife, rejoicing that after all the years of waiting and praying for my husband, God gave me a man who surpassed my dreams.

And now as we finish this lap of ten years, our marriage is so much deeper and richer than I could have ever imagined on our wedding day. With our honest confessions, hurting hearts, prayers, pain, and dreams, we've learned that these are opportunities to know one another better, to choose to be a team, to pursue one another, to honor each other, and to open up our hearts to each other and to the Lord and learn to know ourselves better. Because the truth is, we're not the same people we were when we said, "I do," and I'm thankful for that, but that can also be scary as we change and grow.

Recently, I felt the Lord give me an invitation to tenderly love my husband like no one else has. The Lord told me he has chosen me to be the one to love him—and it truly is a gift. Jodie's book couldn't have come at a better time for us.
